



SOCIAL EQUITY CANNABIS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

DCEO has secured assistance from community-based organizations and education institutions to develop and implement technical assistance programs including virtual events, videos and workshops to assist social equity applicants (SEAs) in their quest to procure and retain a cannabis business license in Illinois. This technical assistance is critical for ensuring equitable representation of small and diverse businesses and entrepreneurs in the emerging cannabis industry.

The Social Equity Cannabis Initiative – Legal Services, Advising, Business Support
