## LICENSE QUALIFICATIONS

### Examination and Endorsement Licensure methods

- **Education:** Document [ED-DOD](#) must be completed by an official of the accredited college/university and it must have school seal affixed. If school does not have a seal, Supporting Document ED-DOD must be notarized.
- **Training:**
  - If you obtained your six (6) months of training from individually approved licensed instructors not affiliated with a training program, document [ED-DOD](#) must be completed by **EACH instructor** certifying to the training they provided. Include a completed course outline of the training program you completed, including a breakdown of credit hours.
  - A copy of your Detection of Deception Trainee Certificate as originally issued by the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation if applicable.

**NOTE:** An examiner should conduct an exam to determine moral good character, and the instructor must be **licensed** to allow credit for the six-month training course study.

- **[CT](#)-Official License Certification** If you have ever been previously licensed, Supporting Document CT must be completed by the U. S. jurisdiction of original licensure (if other than Illinois) and the U. S. jurisdiction where you have most recently been practicing.
- Defense Academy for Assessment Credibility Course or its predecessor or successor (if applicable).

## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION ONCE LICENSED**

- All Deception of Detection Examiner licenses expire on May 31st of each odd-numbered year, regardless of issuance date.
- It is your responsibility to update your contact information including email address with the Department to ensure that you receive all courtesy renewal email reminders and other notifications.
