LICENSE QUALIFICATIONS

Education:

- EXAMINATION BASED ON EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE-Requires Baccalaureate Degree in Law Enforcement, or related field, or business.
- Supporting Document <u>ED</u> must be completed by a school official and have a school seal affixed. If school has no seal, Supporting Document ED must be notarized.

Experience:

If you have ever been licensed as a Private Detective in other states, Supporting
Document <u>CT</u> must be completed by the jurisdictions of licensure where you have been
practicing. You must direct the licensing agency/board(s) to return completed form CT
directly to you.

EXAMINATION - BASED ON EXPERIENCE

- Submit Supporting Document <u>VE-SAC</u> attesting to three (3) years experience out of the five (5) years immediately preceding examination application as a full-time manager administrator for a licensed private security contractor agency;
- OR
- Submit Supporting Document VE-PSF attesting to a minimum of three (3) years
 experience out of the five (5) years immediately preceding examination application as a
 full-time manager of a proprietary security force of 30 or more persons registered with
 the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation;
- OR
- Submit Supporting Document <u>VE-DSC</u> attesting to three (3) years experience out of the
 five (5) years immediately preceding examination application as a full-time supervisor for
 an in-house security unit for a corporation having 100 or more employees, for a military
 police or related security unit in any of the armed forces of the United States, or in a law
 enforcement agency of the federal government, a state, or a state political subdivision
 which shall include full-time experience as a supervisor with a state's attorney's office or

a public defender's office thereof, approved by the Department (in the case of military police experience, applicant should submit a copy of DD214).

OR

You may submit in lieu of the experience requirement referenced above alternative
experience working as a fulltime manager for a private security contractor agency
licensed in another state or for a private security contractor agency in a state that does
not license such agencies if the experience is substantially equivalent to that gained
working for an Illinois licensed private security contractor agency.

OR

For applicants utilizing the experience as referenced in Section 15-10(c) where proof of canine odor detection services for hire since January 1, 2005, is required, the following shall be included: Supporting document <u>VE-CAN</u> to document work experience in canine odor detection services since January 1, 2005; and Certified copies of a minimum of three canine odor detection services contracts prior January 1, 2005.

EXAMINATION BASED ON EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

 Submit Supporting Document <u>VE-SAC</u> attesting to one (1) year experience out of the five (5) years immediately preceding examination application as a full-time manager for a licensed private security contractor agency;

OR

Submit Supporting Document VE-PSF attesting to a minimum of one (1) year experience
out of the five (5) years immediately preceding examination application as a full-time
manager of a proprietary security force of 30 or more persons registered with the Illinois
Department of Professional Regulation;

OR

• Submit Supporting Document <u>VE-DSC</u> attesting to three (3) years experience out of the five (5) years immediately preceding examination application as a full-time supervisor for an in-house security unit for a corporation having 100 or more employees, for a military police or related security unit in any of the armed forces of the United States, or in a law enforcement agency of the federal government, a state, or a state political subdivision which shall include full-time experience as a supervisor with a state's attorney's office or a public defender's office thereof, approved by the Department (in the case of military police experience, applicant should submit a copy of DD214).

OR

You may submit in lieu of the experience requirement referenced above alternative
experience working as a fulltime manager for a private security contractor agency
licensed in another state or for a private security contractor agency in a state that does
not license such agencies if the experience is substantially equivalent to that gained
working for an Illinois licensed private security contractor agency.

REQUIRED SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

<u>ED</u>-Certification of Education must be completed by a school official or have school seal affixed. If school has no seal, supporting document ED must be notarized.

<u>VE-SAC</u>-Supporting Document attesting to type and years of experience.

VE-PSF-Supporting Document attesting to type and years of experience.

VE-DSC-Supporting Document attesting to type and years of experience.

VE-CAN-Supporting document attesting to type and years of experience.

FINGERPRINTS-Fingerprints must be taken within 60 days from the date that the application is submitted to the Department or the Department's testing vendor. A list of licensed Illinois Fingerprint Vendors can be found here. Further instructions on how to complete this requirement can be found here.

<u>CT</u> - Official License Certification — Persons making application on the basis of experience must provide support document(s). If you have ever been licensed as a private detective in other states, supporting document CT must be completed by the jurisdictions of licensure where you have been practicing. You must direct the licensing agency/board(s) to return completed form CT directly to you.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ONCE LICENSED

- All Private Security Contractor licenses expire May 31st every 3 year, regardless of issuance date.
- It is your responsibility to update your contact information including email address with the Department to ensure that you receive all courtesy renewal email reminders and other notifications.
