LICENSE QUALIFICATIONS

Type of training-Applicant must provide the type of odor detection training it intends to offer and submit copies of the following licenses.

- United States Department of Transportation Hazardous Materials Certificate of Registration;
- Drug Enforcement Administration Controlled Substance Registration;
- Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms User of High Explosives Registration;
- Illinois Department of Natural Resources Explosives Storage Certificate; or
- Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation Controlled Substance License Schedule I, II.

Curriculum/course outline:

The following must be covered.

- I. Copy of curriculum/course outline detailing:
 - A. Basis Training shall consist of a minimum of 100 hours and shall include:
 - 1. Canine handling safety procedures;
 - 2. Basis veterinary health and wellness principles, including canine first aid;
 - 3. Principles of canine conditioning;
 - 4. Canine obedience techniques;
 - 5. Search patterns and techniques; and
 - 6. Legal guidelines affecting canine odor detection operations.

<u>Specialized Training</u> shall consist of a minimum of <u>80 hours</u> of additional training related to the particular canine discipline or disciplines in which the canine and canine handler are to be used and may include, without limitation:

- 1. Patrol:
- 2. Narcotics odor detection;
- 3. Explosives odor detection;
- 4. Cadaver odor detection: or
- 5. Any other specialized detection discipline in which the canine and canine handler are to be used.

<u>Instructor Training</u> shall consist of a minimum of <u>20 hours</u> of training with courses in instruction methods related to the disciplines in which the canine instructor shall teach in the course.

- B. The number of hours devoted to each of the above content areas.
- II. Study Materials:
 - A. List of study materials that are used; the location of the materials (i.e., given to students, available in library, etc.).
- III. Description of Policies and Procedures for the maintenance of trainee records:
 - 1. Names
 - 2. Dates of enrollment and completion
 - 3. Attendance
- IV. Copy of the final written examination used to evaluate trainees on classroom material; outline of content the examination is designed to test; and a description of the grading and the established score for passing of the examination.

Drug Enforcement Administration Controlled Substance Registration;

- Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms User of High Explosives Registration;
- Illinois Department of Natural Resources Explosives Storage Certificate; or
- Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation Controlled Substance License Schedule I, II.

REQUIRED SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

You must submit the following:

- A. Copy of curriculum/course
- B. **Study Materials-**List of study materials that are used; the location of the materials (i.e., given to students, available in library, etc.); the number of copies available to students.
- C. Description of Policies and Procedures for the maintenance of trainee records-Names, dates of enrollment and completion, and attendance.
- D. Copy of the final written examination used to evaluate trainees on classroom material.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ONCE LICENSED

- It is your responsibility to update your contact information including email address with the Department to ensure that you receive all courtesy renewal email reminders and other notifications.
- Upon approval of the Canine Instructor Training Course by the Division, this course will be one of the requirements, in addition to proof of 2 years of full-time work experience in order for the canine instructor to apply for a Canine Trainers Authorization Card.
