VARIANCE

Pursuant to the authority granted to me by 68 Illinois Administrative Code 1300.60, I hereby grant a variance to the provision of 68 Illinois Administrative Code 1300.40 which indicate that every Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (“APRN”) and Registered Professional Nurse (“RN”) licenses, and 1300.130(c)(6) Nursing Continuing Education Sponsor license issued under the Illinois Nurse Practice Act shall expire on May 31st of each even-numbered year. Licensees are granted until June 30, 2026 to complete the process.

This variance is granted based upon the transition to new data and operating systems utilized by the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation (“Department”).

The purpose of this Variance is to ensure that licensed APRNs, RNs, and Nursing Continuing Education Sponsor, who are otherwise eligible to renew and whose licenses would otherwise expire on May 31, 2026 do not experience an expired or lapsed license, and are not required to take additional steps or pay additional fees to restore the license prior to June 30, 2026.

This Variance is in no way intended to waive or modify any other statute, rule, or regulation concerning the license of an APRN, RN, or Nursing Continuing Education sponsor nor to extend the active licensure period beyond the expiration date for licenses otherwise required to be renewed by May 31, 2026. Licenses renewed through June 30, 2026, during the extended renewal period granted by this Variance, shall expire at the end of the ordinary renewal period designated by the relevant regulation applicable to the profession.

I have determined that the provision from which this variance is granted is not statutorily mandated; no party will be injured by the granting of this variance; and the rule from which this variance is granted would, in this particular case, be unreasonable.
