

MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS AND SPOUSES

The Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR) knows how critical it is to military families to begin working as soon as they come to the Prairie State.

Illinois law includes several provisions designed to help military Service Members and Spouses who are an active duty member or whose active duty service concluded within the preceding two years before application. One of these laws states that once you or your spouse have submitted all the required documents and fee as part of your license application, your application will be reviewed within 30 days.

In addition to expedited review of your application, the Department's dedicated Military Liaison will work with you and your military installation's military and family support center to help you through the licensing process. The following is a whitepaper to assist military Service Members and Spouses.



NCEES Annual Business Meeting

Delegates from the Illinois Professional Land Surveyor, Professional Engineering, and Structural Engineering Boards attended the 2023 National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) Annual Business Meeting on August 15-17, 2023 in Boston, Massachusetts.

During this meeting, the delegates conducted central zone business, participated in national elections of NCEES officers and listened to sessions pertaining to the future of engineering and surveying practices & how regulatory boards can keep pace with evolving technology, and the current regulatory environment and what boards can do to ensure they are communicating the important work they do to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public.

Did someone say Renewal time?

The Professional Engineer license is currently in renewal through 11/30/2023. Renewal is required for all licensees, regardless of when the license is issued. On or near September 1st, all active professional engineer licensees should have received an email with instructions on how to renew the license through the online portal.

Unless renewed, the license will expire on 11/30/2023.

You may review the renewal requirements at the below sections of the rules for the administration of the Professional Engineering Practicing Act.

Note, if you renew your license online during the pre-renewal period, you are NOT required to submit proof of your PDH's to the Department. You are only required to submit proof of completion of your PDH's if you submit a paper renewal/reinstatement after the expiration date or you are required to do so by the Enforcement Unit as part of a random audit.

A reminder, the Rules were recently updated to allow for carryover of acceptable excess PDHs. A maximum of 15 hours gained between June 1st and November 30th that will not be used for the 2023 renewal may be carried over toward the 2025 renewal. Hours must be documented and maintained on the carryover form.

DIVISION DIRECTOR CHANGE



As of September 22, 2023, Cecilia Abundis, Director for the Division of Professional Regulation, resigned to pursue another opportunity.

Illinois Governor JB Pritzker has appointed Camile Lindsay as the new Acting Director for the Division of Professional Regulation. In this role, Lindsay manages the licensing, enforcement, and oversight of more than a million professionals over 70 professions and more than 200 license types. She started on October 16, 2023.

Camile joins the Department from Governor Pritzker's Office, where she served as First Assistant Deputy Governor for infrastructure, public safety, environment, and energy. She oversaw several Illinois state agencies, including the Department of Transportation, State Police, Department of Corrections, Emergency Management Agency, and the Capital Development Board.

Prior to joining the Governor's Office, Camile served as Chief of Staff and Chief Legal Counsel for the Illinois Department of Corrections. Earlier in her career, she worked as Supervisory Regional Counsel for the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, Assistant Attorney General for the Illinois Attorney General's office, and Assistant State's Attorney for the Cook County State's Attorney's office.




