File A Complaint and Help Protect the Public

The Division of Professional Regulation (DPR) is legislatively mandated to administer and enforce 59 separate legislative acts that regulate the conduct of many professions in Illinois.

Complaints against any individual or entity regulated by DPR may be filed by contacting the Complaint Intake Unit. The complaint may be submitted anonymously if desired. Once the department receives the complaint, it will be submitted to our Enforcement Unit for investigation and prosecution if determined to be warranted.

Disciplinary action resulting from any enforcement action varies by violation and severity and can include: **termination** of license, revocation, suspension, probation, reprimand, and censure. The license may also be ordered to remain in good standing. In addition, Illinois law allows for the imposition of fines up to **\$10,000 per offense** for any of the professions regulated by the Division. Following a final decision by the Director, the licensee has 35 days to make an appeal in circuit court under the Illinois Administrative Review Act. Investigations referred for criminal prosecution have also resulted in numerous criminal convictions.

However, even with the best investigative team and prosecuting attorneys, the most valuable asset the Division has against violations is you. You know your profession and we need your help in safeguarding public safety.

Please note: Pursuant to Illinois law (20 ILCS 2105/2105-117), all information collected by the Department during an examination or investigation of a licensee, registrant, or applicant is confidential and cannot be publicly disclosed. This includes complaints and any information collected during an investigation. Exceptions to this law exist only for law enforcement, other regulatory agencies with appropriate regulatory interest or a party presenting a lawful subpoena.

RENEWAL REMINDER

The Professional Engineer license is set to renew later this year, with an expiration date of November 30, 2021.

Approximately 90 days prior to the expiration date, all active PE licensees should receive a courtesy renewal reminder email in with the link and PIN number (listed in the email subject line) to renew the license.

Licensees with a U.S. postal address may renew online. Licensees with an address outside the U.S. must renew using the paper renewal form.
