PERC LICENSEES!

Are You a Current, Non-Renewed, or Suspended/Revoked PERC Licensee?



Did you know that under the Private Detective, Private Alarm, Private Security, Fingerprint Vendor, and Locksmith Act, you must report any convictions or arrests within 30 days to the Department even if your license is not renewed, has been suspended, or is revoked?

Section 1240.540(a) of the Illinois Administrative Code states "(a) All licensees and registrants shall notify the Division in writing within 30 days after any convictions, arrests, felony information, and/or indictments against him or her and shall provide a copy of that notification to his or her current employer, if any."

If you have been arrested or convicted you need to:

- Complete the Thirty Day Arrest & Conviction Reporting Form.

- Email the form to FPR.DPREAU@illinois.gov within thirty (30) days of your arrest or conviction.

What can happen if you fail to report a conviction or arrest?

Your license can be disciplined by the Department with penalties that include, but are not limited to, a refusal to renew, reprimand, probation, suspension, or revocation.
