How to Get a License if you are a Military Service Member or Their Spouse?

STEP 1

- Gather your documents:
 - Proof of your assignment to a duty station in Illinois, within 6 months after the date of application for licensure.
 - Proof of you or your spouse's active military status: DD214, Letter of Service signed by Unit Commanding Officer, or Proof of Service document from the Servicemember's electronic personnel portal
 - Proof for Spouses: Military Permanent Change of Station Orders with the spouse identified by name; Official Notification of Change of Assignment with your marriage license, a certified DD1172 verifying marital status, or a letter signed by the commanding officer verifying change of assignment and the name of the military spouse

STEP 2

- Review the licensing requirements and application for your profession by visiting the Department's website.
- As part of your application you may be required to submit documentation or information from third parties such as certified transcripts, test results and/or fingerprint background checks. Please note it can take several weeks for information from third parties to be received by the Department so start early!

STEP 3

- If available for your profession, create an online account and submit an online application. For some professions you may need to download a paper application and submit by mail. With all applications you will need to submit all required forms or documents and pay all required fees.
- As part of your application, be sure to check the applicable box to indicated that you are a Military Service Member or Spouse and be sure to provide one of the documents mentioned in Step 1.
