"Certified veterinary technician" is the protected term. Occasional misuse of term "veterinary nurse," which is not recognized by

	statute. "Nurse" is protected title in Illinois. Public confused by use of nurse in veterinary context. Suggestion that article be shared with ISVMA members (and IDFPR licensees, if possible) clarifying difference between statute-defined licensed vet tecs and other more creativelynamed unlicensed veterinary staff.
